

**Dickinson County Board of Supervisors
June 15, 2010**

9:30 a.m. Present are Supervisors Mardi Allen, Vice-Chairperson Paul Johnson, Wayne Northey, Chairperson David Gottsche and Pam Jordan.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited to open the meeting.

The Board of Supervisors met as a Board of Canvassers at 9:30 A.M. to canvass the election returns from the June 8, 2010 Primary Election. After opening and canvassing the returns of each voting precinct in the county, the following county candidates were declared as the nominee to the respective listed office and will appear on the General Election Ballot, November 2, 2010.

Moved by Northey, seconded by Allen to approve the full year beer permit renewal application of Nancy Yarns dba Sand Bar Beach Resort. All voted aye.

Moved by Northey, seconded by Allen to approve the full year cigarette permit applications, to be effective July 1, 2010, for Vicks Corner, Silver Lake County Club and Okoboji View Golf Course. All voted aye.

County Engineer present. A resident of Montgomery has request that the 20 foot alley bounded by Lots 2, 3, and 4, of Block 6, Montgomery be closed or vacated. The resident requesting is Gwen Anderson, adjoining property owner. Philip Crosby, adjoining property owner, also present and is objecting to the closing or vacation of the alley as he would need it for access to his property. The issue of the streets and alleys of Montgomery being dedicated to the public was brought up and was not resolved. County Engineer will be further research on the request, but at this time no action was taken by the Board.

Assistant County Attorney present. The County is currently contracted with Seasons Center in Spencer for mental health services for county clients, and that contract expires June 30, 2010. Three options for the county were outlined: 1) continue with the yearly contract with Seasons Center 2) go with a month-to-month contract (for six months) with Seasons Center for mental health and case management services or 3) or explore other options with a different vender. Assistant County Attorney recommended to the board that they continue with Seasons Center with a month to month contract at the rate

of \$9,184 per month. The Board agreed with this option and authorized the Assistant County Attorney to work out the details of the mental health services and case management services contracts with Seasons Center officials for month to month contracts and to return next week for Board approval.

There being no further items for business presented before the Board, it was moved by Jordan, seconded by Allen to adjourn.
