Dickinson County Launches Prescription Drug Discount Card That Can be Used by All Residents

Discount Cards Offering Average Savings Of 20 Percent Off Retail Price

Spirit Lake, Iowa – Dickinson County today launched a discount card program to help consumers cope with the high price of prescription drugs. The county is making free prescription drug discount cards available under a program sponsored by the National Association of Counties (NACo) that offers average savings of 20 percent off the retail price of commonly prescribed drugs.

The cards may be used by all county residents, regardless of age, income, or existing health coverage, and are accepted at all of the county's pharmacies. A national network of more than 57,000 participating retail pharmacies also will honor the NACo prescription discount card.

“Dickinson County is proud to be one of the counties nationwide participating with NACo,” said Beth Will, Dickinson County Community Services Director. “The NACo prescription discount card offers significant savings for the uninsured and underinsured residents of our county, and even those fortunate to have prescription coverage can use the card to save money on drugs that are not covered by their health plan. Residents do not have to be Medicare beneficiaries to be eligible for this program.”

Cards will be available at Dickinson County Community Services Office, and Dickinson County Department of Human Services. County residents can call 712-336-0775 or visit <https://naco.advancrx.com> for assistance with the program.

“Using the NACo prescription discount card is easy,” said Beth Will. “Simply present it at a participating pharmacy. There is no enrollment form, no membership fee and no restrictions or limits on frequency of use. Cardholders and their family members may use the card any time their prescriptions are not covered by insurance.”

The program is administered by Caremark.
