

## 12-10-09 EOB Construction meeting notes

Attending: Chris Beck – Beck Excavating, Scott Brunsvold & Jeff Rose– JWA, Jim Leinbaugh – IGLSD, Arnie McIntosh – EOB Assoc President, Derek Mananny – Clean Water Alliance, Mardi Allen – D C Supervisor

Scott gave an update of the status of the project since the last construction meeting.

- The rest of Shoreline and Babs paving are completed
- All curb and gutters are completed
- Manhole adjustments are done
- Grading is substantially completed
- Dormant permanent seeding has been applied
- Mulch was put down on Monday (12-7-09)
- The floating silt fences have been taken out – Beck has them if they need to be re-installed next year.

The following items were discussed:

- All LID work will begin next summer after the ground has dried out from the spring rains. Beck would like to avoid trucking through the wet ditches if possible.
- All paved driveways are done except those on Shoreline and one on Walleye. These will have to be done next spring.
- The County is plowing the snow and sanding but it appears they might be salting and this might pit the new concrete. Scott will call Dan and remind him – Beck doesn't want this to be a liability issue next spring.
- The rock and concrete in the manholes and sewer lines were discussed. Chris will contact CTI and get a status of the cleanout. They had received a quote \$250 per hour.
- North end mailboxes will remain at the EOB entrance until the project is completed next spring. This will keep them out of the way while the LID projects are being installed.
- Eco Patch, a sub of Clayton & Sons, a sub of Beck, wants 3 preinstall payments. Beck will contact Clayton & Sons and discuss the timing. Beck is looking at late June or early July as the earliest they would need the native grass in coconut mats.
- Scott reviewed the Team Services bills – Mardi will check on the \$5,698.90 and \$1,267.30 bills.
- The light by the DNR parking was discussed again. Scott will see if he can find out who it belongs to. Jim McShane would like to see the light directed down more toward the parking.
- Qwest still has wiring lying around – especially on Babs and Martin and there are still pedestals to move.
- Buffalo grass can be used as an alternate to conventional seeding of the foreslopes and backslopes, if residents want to buy and plant it themselves.
- We need to ask Steve Anderson if it will be okay to mow the ditches. We know there will be no burning in the ditches and no raking of leaves into the ditches.
- Speed limit signs have been placed at the entrances – 25mph. There will be 10mph signs placed on each curve sign already installed throughout.
